It has come to light that the response to your second question issued on the 28 July 2021 incorrectly quoted £75,448,996.25 as the amount paid to Capita between June 2016 and June 2021. The amount that should have been quoted for this period was £104,175,820.04. I apologise for this error, and am now re-issuing a corrected response to your FOI request, as follows.

I wish to confirm that the Department has now completed its search for the information which you requested in your e-mail of 29 June 2021. I have responded to each request separately below.

1) What bonus' and incentives are given to staff when working on PIP?

Capita Disability Assessors (DAs) have the opportunity to earn an additional £3,000 per year, if quality and quantity targets are achieved.

2) How much money has CAPITA been awarded up to todays date to provide this service?

The Department has paid Capita £104,175,820.04 from June 2016 to June 2021 for the administration of PIP health assessments.

3) How much money do they expect to get for the renewal of the contract?

Departmental officials are currently working to secure an extension, with improvements to the current contract for PIP Assessment Services. The estimated cost of this extension with Capita is £31.9m for the period August 2021 to July 2023.

If you are dissatisfied with this response and wish to request a review of our decision or make a complaint about how your request has been handled, you may ask for an internal review within two calendar months of the date of this letter.
